MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: Meeting was called to order by Chairman Waddington at 7:33 P.M. Chairman Waddington led the salute to the flag and read a statement regarding the Open Public Meetings Act.

**ROLL CALL:** Commissioner Waddington – present, Commissioner Briggs – present, Commissioner Wakeley – present, Commissioner Hagarty – absent, Commissioner Harris – present.

<u>OTHER OFFICIALS PRESENT</u>: Chief Hunter, Battalion Chief Pizzo, Captain Duvall, Solicitor Carlamere

MINUTES: Chairman Waddington asked if there were any questions regarding the workshop, regular and closed session minutes for the meeting held on January 8, 2025. There were none. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Commissioner Wakeley and seconded by Commissioner Harris.

Roll Call Vote: Commissioner Waddington – yes, Commissioner Briggs – yes, Commissioner Wakeley – yes, Commissioner Hagarty - absent, Commissioner Harris - yes. Motion passed with four yes votes.

**COMMUNICATIONS LIST:** Chairman Waddington asked if there were any questions regarding the communications as listed on the agenda regarding proof of publication in the Courier Post of the 2025 workshop meeting dates. There were none.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Chairman Waddington announced that Commissioner Briggs was appointed as the Fire Equipment and Apparatus Liaison.

• Fire Equipment and Apparatus Liaison: No report from Commissioner Briggs. Battalion Chief Pizzo had an apparatus report: Two lower motors on Tower 6 was repaired by Firefighter Gordon Sr. Gloucester Township garage repaired the leaking water pump on the Tower ladder. Firefighter Gordon Sr repaired the back of the ladder. They are still waiting for Fire & Safety to make repairs. The switch on the seat for the air lift was repaired along with the seatbelt for Tower ladder. There are a couple of other issues with the ladder sensors which they are looking into. For the Engine, they are still working on repairing the lights for the tank indicator. Discharge gauge parts were ordered by Firefighter Gordon Sr. The lift cylinder was repaired by Gloucester Township. Squad was discharged but they are waiting on some things from Fire & Safety. The leaking hose on Squad was repaired by Gloucester Township along with the winch inserts. There is a big problem with the rescue compartment, which they believe is from the Squad vehicle that was in the t-

bone accident years ago. The back compartment is separating and falling off from the rest of the truck. Firefighter Gordon Sr and Captain Duvall are working with vendors to repair it. Check engine lights are coming on in some of the trucks. Gloucester Township is working to repair that. The brush truck needs new tires. Battalion Chief Pizzo said that he will send Commissioner Briggs all updates regarding the repairs. Chairman Waddington and Commissioner Briggs thanked him.

- Community Relations Liaison: Commissioner Harris said he sees the department has been busy. He mentioned the fire in Shenandoah Village. Commissioner Harris said he saw that Firefighter Hitzelberger put together events for the Pine Hill schools which were attended on the nights of January 23<sup>rd</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. Commissioner Harris said he hadn't seen any pictures from the event on the Fire Department's Facebook page. Chief Hunter said they hadn't been uploaded yet.
- Information Technology and Equipment Commissioner: No report
- **Insurance Fund Commissioner:** Commissioner Hagarty was absent so there was no report.
- **Fire Prevention Commissioner:** Chairman Waddington announced that Commissioner Briggs will be the Fire Prevention Commissioner. There was no report.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Chairman Waddington asked if there were any questions regarding the resolutions listed on the agenda. There were no questions.

#### • Resolution 25-19: Approval and Payment of Bills

• A motion to approve resolution 25-19 was made by Commissioner Wakeley and seconded by Commissioner Harris.

Roll Call Vote: Commissioner Waddington – yes, Commissioner Briggs – yes, Commissioner Wakeley – yes, Commissioner Hagarty - absent, Commissioner Harris - yes. Motion passed with four yes votes.

#### Discussion on Cancer Screenings for Firefighters law

• Chairman Waddington said if he read the email correctly, state law sounds like career firefighters need to be tested every three years for cancer screenings and there are eleven different things they are tested for. If the career firefighter does not participate in the state insurance, they will be reimbursed up to \$1,250.00 for the test. Chief Hunter said Interstate Mobile got back to him and said they could do a couple of the tests but they are unaware of the state law and are looking into it. If they can't do all the tests, we will have to find another company. Chief Hunter said if we have health benefits we are required to

send them to get this test and take record of it. Chairman Waddington said that if anyone doesn't have insurance, the Fire District will pay for it and then get reimbursed. Chief Hunter said he couldn't tell if the law applies to the volunteer firefighters so he will have to look into that. Chairman Waddington and Commissioner Wakeley said they were under the impression that it only applied to career firefighters. Chief Hunter said he offered the volunteer firefighters the option to be tested every three years, but they don't have to do it. Chairman Waddington said to wait to hear from Interstate Mobile, and if they can't do the screenings then to see what service other departments are using. Chief Hunter said there is a mobile unit that comes to each firehouse. Commissioner Wakeley asked if that is what Interstate Mobile does. Chief Hunter said yes, but this service is strictly for cancer screenings.

### Discussion on purchasing at Pine Hill Hardware

Chairman Waddington said that the chiefs want to be able to make purchases at Pine Hill Hardware again. Solicitor Carlamere said it is not a problem. Commissioner Harris will not be able to vote on anything related to bills or purchase orders for Pine Hill Hardware. Solicitor Carlamere said there is no need to have a vote and the District can start making purchases at Pine Hill Hardware again. Chairman Waddington said that Commissioner Harris would prefer only one or two people from the District being able to make purchases at Pine Hill Hardware. Chief Hunter said one of the biggest problems with making purchases at Pine Hill Hardware was they were getting one bill mixed in with the Fire Department's purchases. Battalion Chief Pizzo said they have since changed that and when the District goes to make a purchase at Pine Hill Hardware, they have to write it on a log. Chief Hunter said they have a way of tracking the purchases. Chairman Waddington requested that they come up with a way to make the process easier on Pine Hill Hardware. Commissioner Harris said they will work on it.

## o Resolution 25-21: Authorize Participation as Training Facility

• Captain Duvall brought to the Commission's attention that he wants to have Pine Hill's training facility registered. Battalion Chief Pizzo said that they need to certify themselves as a training facility so that they can hold classes there. Commissioner Harris said that he thought they were already holding training classes there. Battalion Chief Pizzo said that it is not recognized by the state. Captain Duvall made a sample resolution. Battalion Chief Pizzo said it is to get CEUs for training. Captain Duvall explained the resolution. He said it allows them to have training classes at the firehouse, submit them to the state, and get recognition for the classes from the state. He said it is free; they just need a resolution from the Fire District to move forward. Commissioners Harris, Wakeley, and Briggs said they had no problem with that. Solicitor Carlamere asked in authorizing participation in

the program, what is the requirement for the facility to qualify? Captain Duvall said they must have a certain amount of seating, a designated classroom, and be up to fire code. A motion to pass resolution 25-21 was made by Commissioner Wakeley and seconded by Commissioner Briggs.

Roll Call Vote: Commissioner Waddington – yes, Commissioner Briggs – yes, Commissioner Wakeley – yes, Commissioner Hagarty - absent, Commissioner Harris - yes. Motion passed with four yes votes.

**FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT:** See attached report. Chief Hunter said he would like to discuss passing a resolution for MVA billing at the next meeting. They need to put a dollar figure on it. He should have it ready by the next meeting. The only thing they will need to decide is whether we will bill the residents of Pine Hill.

Chief Hunter also said that the ladder truck is now twenty years old. He is told that a lot of parts for it, including the motor, they can't get anymore. He said we need to figure out what to do about it soon because it is starting to nickel and dime us and is only getting worse. Commissioner Harris suggested making that a topic for the next workshop meeting. Chief Hunter said we can but they have already looked into it. Commissioner Harris said it is a good workshop topic. Chief Hunter said waiting a month to discuss it isn't going to kill us but that we need to make a plan going forward because it could take three years to get these parts. If something happens to the motor, the truck will be out of service. Commissioner Wakeley asked if they need to make payments on a new truck. Chief Hunter said we can finance firetrucks over 30 years. Solicitor Carlamere clarified the statute in New Jersey. He said the municipality pays rent on the property and after 30 years they will turn it over to the municipality. He said there is a specific procedure we would have to go through. Chief Hunter said he was looking into something else and he can provide the literature on it, but he is okay with what Solicitor Carlamere said, too.

FIRE OFFICIAL'S REPORT: See attached report for December 2024.

#### FIRE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT: See attached report.

Chairman Waddington asked if there were any questions regarding the reports presented. There were none. A motion to approve all reports presented was made by Commissioner Wakeley and seconded by Commissioner Harris. All were in favor, except Commissioner Hagarty who was absent. Motion passed with four yes votes.

**OPEN THE FLOOR TO THE PUBLIC**: Chairman Waddington asked for a motion to open the floor to the public. A motion to open the floor to the public was made by Commissioner

Wakeley and seconded by Commissioner Briggs. All were in favor, except for Commissioner Hagarty who was absent. Motion passed.

Keith Kemery, President of IAFF 3249, whose address is 26 Poplar Street, Sicklerville, NJ 08081, addressed the Commission. He said he believed the Commission had received correspondence from him which they will discuss in executive session as well as a matter regarding Chief Hunter from last month's meeting. Chairman Waddington confirmed this.

<u>CLOSE FLOOR TO THE PUBLIC</u>: Chairman Waddington asked for a motion to close the floor to the public if there were no other questions. There were none. A motion to close the floor to the public was made by Commissioner Wakeley and seconded by Commissioner Harris. All were in favor, except for Commissioner Hagarty who was absent. Motion passed with four yes votes.

**RESOLUTION 25-20: CLOSED SESSION:** Chairman Waddington explained that there was a need to enter a closed session to discuss personnel issues.

• A motion to approve resolution 25-20 was made by Commissioner Wakeley and seconded by Commissioner Briggs. All were in favor, except Commissioner Hagarty who was absent. Motion passed with four yes votes.

Meeting temporarily adjourned at 8:00 p.m.

**CALL TO ORDER:** Chairman Waddington called the meeting back to order at 9:46 p.m. and asked for a roll call.

**ROLL CALL:** Commissioner Waddington – present, Commissioner Briggs – present, Commissioner Wakeley – present, Commissioner Hagarty – absent, Commissioner Harris – present.

**OUTCOME OF CLOSED SESSION:** Chairman Waddington said that there was a need to vote on a matter regarding paying Captain Duvall for missed hours at his second job. A motion to approve this resolution was made by Commissioner Wakeley and seconded by Commissioner Harris.

Roll Call Vote: Commissioner Waddington – no, Commissioner Briggs – yes, Commissioner Wakeley – yes, Commissioner Hagarty - absent, Commissioner Harris - yes. Motion passed with three yes votes.

<u>ADJOURNMENT:</u> Chairman Waddington asked if there were any other issues that needed to be addressed. There were none. A motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Wakeley and seconded by Commissioner Harris. All were in favor, except Commissioner Hagarty who was absent. Motion passed with four yes votes.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:47 p.m.

## Governor Murphy Signs Legislation Mandating Access to Periodic Cancer Screenings it of GovMurphy) **Firefighters** (https://www.facebook.com/governorphilmurphy)

TRENTON – Governor Murphy today signed legislation that mandates access to periodic cancer screening examinations for firefighters who are not enrolled in the State Health Benefits Program (SHBP), but who are eligible for enrollment in the SHBP by public employment.

Current law entitles a paid, full-time firefighter enrolled in the SHBP or a firefighter employed by a public employer that does not participate in the SHBP, to a cancer screening examination every three years.

This bill (S2890 (https://pub.njleg.state.nj.us/Bills/2024/S3000/2890\_I1.PDF)) now extends this benefit to firefighters who waive their employer-sponsored health care but are still eligible for coverage under the SHBP through their employment with a public employer. The State will now reimburse up to \$1,250 per three-year period for each firefighter's examination, regardless of their participation in their employer's health care plan.

"Thousands of firefighters across the state put their lives on the line for their communities," said Governor Murphy. "We must do what we can to provide these incredible men and women with the health care they deserve. Preventive cancer screenings will not only save lives and reduce unnecessary suffering, but also ensure our public servants remain healthy."

"This law will help ensure our firefighters, who are regularly exposed to carcinogens through their line of work, will always have access to periodic cancer screenings," said Senator Greenstein. "Previous law left a portion of our firefighters out of this guaranteed coverage, unnecessarily leaving them at higher risk. With this reform, they will be better protected and more incentivized to obtain preventative care, which will save lives."

"Early detection can make a real difference in the outcome of a cancer diagnosis," said Senator Joe Cryan. "These cancer screenings can save lives, prevent needless suffering, and avoid costly treatment. The firefighters who serve our communities and protect our residents have more than earned the right for this care. This law will provide more incentive and support to have this preventive care done."

"Firefighters can be exposed to hazardous toxins, leading to a higher risk of cancer," said Assemblyman Sterley Stanley. "Cancer screening leads to early detection and early diagnosis, both of which give cancer patients the best possible chance for a successful outcome. I am thrilled to see this bill become law, because I know the profound impact it will have in the lives of so many first responders."

"Professional firefighters put themselves, their safety, and their health on the line each day, not hesitating to take heroic risks to save someone they likely don't even know," said Assemblywoman Verlina Reynolds-Jackson. "Now, thanks to the law being signed today, many more of these brave individuals can gain access to lifesaving cancer

screening exams."

"Firefighters across the state work to keep each of us safe in our communities, risking their lives on a routine basis," said Assemblywoman Shanique Speight. "We need to do what we can to protect them. By reimbursing local employers to pay for firefighters' for free cancer screening exams, we are making sure their health and safety is a priority."

"The signing of A3939/S2890 by Gov. Phil Murphy is the culmination of our comprehensive cancer screening program for active career firefighters. This legislation eliminates the financial burden on our municipalities and fire districts to pay for the screenings and having to wait for reimbursement from Treasury. This ensures our members will have access to the critical testing needed because of occupational hazards. Firefighters throughout our nation are being diagnosed with cancer every day. In New Jersey, Firefighter Glen Seaboldt, a 10 year veteran of the Edison Fire Department was diagnosed with Stage 2 non-Hodgkin lymphoma. He received early treatment and is currently in remission. While Glen's cancer was found to be more advanced this screening program has already identified pre-cancer and Stage 1 conditions in multiple firefighters in our state who have been treated and are returning to work with minimal sick leave," said Matthew Caliente, President of the Professional Firefighters of the professional Firefighting form and protective garments, or the toxic gas emissional flows of the professional flows of the p

"Today, let us remember NJ FMBA Legislative Chairman Bobby Allen. Bobby recently succumbed to a valiant fight against cancer. The NJ FMBA has been advocating for cancer screening, presumptive legislation, and cancer registry for years. Had this legislation been around years ago, Bobby may still be with us. Thank you, Governor Murphy and our Legislators who have taken a decades-long fight and brought it to reality. Cancer is the number one killer of Firefighters and this legislation will undoubtedly save lives." said Eddie Donnelly, President of the New Jersey Firefighters Mutual Benevolent Association.

"This bill signing is another step forward for Firefighters to receive early detection screenings for a variety of types of cancer. The sooner cancers are detected will mean easier and shorter treatment which in most cases will lead to the Firefighter becoming cancer-free," said Robert Ordway, President of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association.

## Firefighter Cancer Screening Reimbursement Program For Government Entities Not Participating In SHBP

N.J.S.A 52:14-17.29ii(a) requires access to periodic cancer screenings for full-time paid firefighters not enrolled in the State Health Benefits Plan (SHBP) and firefighters who are employed by an SHBP-covered entity, but have waived SHBP coverage, within three years after the start of the firefighter's employment and every three years thereafter during the course of employment. The examination shall include, at a minimum and as applicable, the screening for eleven types of cancer pursuant to N.J.S.A 52:14-17.29ii(a). The State of New Jersey, through the Department of the Treasury's Division of Administration, will reimburse eligible public employers a maximum of \$1,250 per firefighter over a three year period towards the costs associated with providing the required cancer screenings. Public employers may submit a request to Treasury for payment based on satisfactory proof of a legitimate invoice from a health care provider for an eligible firefighter's screening.


The Division of Administration is utilizing an online portal to submit claims called SimpliGov. An authorized representative for the public employer, who will be responsible for submitting claims, should fill out the <u>registration</u> form. The authorized representative will be required to upload a letter on public employer letterhead attesting to his or her authority to submit claims on behalf of the public employer

Once the registration has been approved, the authorized representative will receive an email from Stephanie Hunt with instructions on how to set up the SimpliGov dashboard on their myNJ account. Instructions will also be provided on creating a myNJ account, should the authorized representative not already have an account. The SimpliGov dashboard will allow the authorized representative to submit claims as well as check the status of previously submitted claims.

A <u>PowerPoint presentation</u> is also available to guide public employers through the registration and claim submittal process.

P.L. 2024, CHAPTER 15, *approved June 3, 2024* Assembly, No. 3939 An Acr mandating access to periodic cancer screening examinations for full-time paid firefighters not enrolled in the State Health Benefits Program, and amending P.L.2021, c.478.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 1 of P.L.2021, c.478 (C.52:14-17.29ii) is amended to read as follows:
- 1. a. A firefighter employed as a full-time paid employee of a fire department or unit of this State or a political subdivision of this State shall be provided a cancer screening examination conducted by a physician not less than three years after the start of the firefighter's employment as a firefighter and every three years thereafter during the course of the firefighter's employment. The examination shall include screening for, at a minimum and when applicable, the following cancers:
  - (1) colon;
  - (2) lung;
  - (3) bladder;
  - (4) oral;
  - (5) thyroid;
  - (6) skin;
  - (7) blood;
  - (8) breast;
  - (9) cervical
  - (10) testicular; and
  - (11) prostate.
- b. Subsection a. of this section shall apply to a firefighter enrolled in the State Health Benefits Program as occupational coverage. For the purpose of this subsection, employment as a full-time paid employee of a fire department or unit of this State or a political subdivision of this State shall be a pre-existing condition.
- c. (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, rule, or regulation to the contrary, beginning January 1, 2023 and for each plan year thereafter, a public employer that does not participate in the State Health Benefits Program shall provide health care benefits coverage for its employees that offers cancer screening examinations consistent with the requirement of subsection a. of this section. A public employer that does not participate in the State Health Benefits Program shall be eligible for [reimbursement] payment from the State for [its] the cost of providing benefits coverage for such examinations upon proof satisfactory to the Department of the Treasury that the examination has been performed by a physician; provided, however, at no time shall the cost being [reimbursed] remitted to the public employer by the State for the full examination required under subsection a. of this section exceed \$1,250 per three-year period for each firefighter.
- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, rule, or regulation to the contrary, beginning on the effective date of P.L., c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill), a public employer that participates in the State Health Benefits Program shall provide coverage for cancer screening examinations consistent with the requirement of subsection a. of this section for an employee who is eligible for other health care coverage and waives coverage under the State Health Benefits Program to

which the employee is entitled by virtue of employment with the employer. Such public employer shall be eligible for payment from the State for the cost of providing such examinations upon proof satisfactory to the Department of the Treasury that the examination has been performed by a physician; provided, however, at no time shall the cost being remitted to the public employer by the State for the full examination required under subsection a. of this section exceed \$1,250 per three-year period for each firefighter.

No co-payment, deductible, coinsurance, or out-of-pocket expense shall be required for such examinations.

A public employer shall maintain adequate records to facilitate the reimbursement authorized pursuant to this subsection.

For the purpose of this subsection, employment as a full-time paid employee of a fire department or unit of this State or a political subdivision of this State shall be a pre-existing condition. There shall be an appropriation from the State General Fund in each annual appropriations act of such funds as necessary for the purposes of this section. (cf. P.L.2022, c.109, s.1)

2. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### STATEMENT

This bill mandates access to periodic cancer screening examinations for firefighters who waive employer-sponsored health care coverage, but are eligible for coverage under the State Health Benefits Program (SHBP) by virtue of employment with a public employer that participates in the SHBP. Current law entitles a firefighter enrolled in the SHBP, or a firefighter employed by a public employer that does not participate in the SHBP, to a cancer screening examinations every three years and specifies that the State will reimburse providers or such public employers an amount not to exceed \$1,250 per three-year period. The bills extends these reimbursement provisions to firefighters who waive employer-sponsored health care coverage, but are eligible for coverage under the SHBP by virtue of employment with a public employer that participates in the SHBP.

Mandates access to periodic cancer screening examinations for professional firefighters not enrolled in SHBP, but who are eligible for SHBP by virtue of public employment.
